♦ REMEMBERING PEARL HARBOR

An Etowah man will never forget the morning of December 7, 1941. Frank Landreth was in the Army, stationed in Pearl Harbor, and was standing in line in front of the chow hall that Sunday morning when a lot of planes came over. Landreth says he thought the Air Corps was conducting maneuvers. But when the planes started bombing Wheeler Air Field and strafing the barracks, he quickly realized the Japanese were attacking. Landreth recalls that the Japanese destroyed all the U.S. planes at the air field except for one or two. Soon, officers came and told the soldiers to get in the barracks. When the smoke had cleared, nearly 2,400 American servicemen and civilians had died in the attack and America's Pacific Naval fleet was severely crippled.

The White House and Congressional Republicans have reached a deal that will extend the Bush tax cuts for all Americans for two more years. Other deals include extending unemployment benefits from 99 weeks max now, for 13 more months and reduction of payroll taxes for individuals from 6.2% to 4.2% for one year.

• Continental Airlines and one of its mechanics have been convicted in a French court of manslaughter because debris from one of its planes caused the crash of an Air France Concorde jet that killed 113 people on July 25, 2000. The mechanic was accused of improperly installing a titanium strip on the DC-10. The piece of metal came loose, fell onto the runway, and gashed the Concorde's tire. Pieces of rubber from the tire flew into the fuel tanks and caused a fire. Continental was ordered to pay Air France \$1.43 million.

• People who neglect to get a flu vaccine this year run the risk of getting sick more than once. That's because there are three different flu viruses circulating this year. Fortunately, the flu vaccine protects against all three strains.

 Don Meredith, former Dallas Cowboys quarterback and an original member of ABC's "Monday Night Football" broadcast team, has died from a brain hemorrhage in Sante Fe, New Mexico. He was 72.
