• Stocks were almost flat Tuesday after the President and Republican leaders agreed to tax cuts and unemployment benefits extensions. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed at 11,359.16; down 3.03.

• A British judge sent WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange to jail on Tuesday, denying him bail after Assange vowed to fight efforts to be extradited to Sweden to face sex crime charges.

• The company which makes Copenhagen and Skoal brands of smokeless tobacco has agreed to pay \$5 million to the family of a North Carolina man who died of mouth cancer. The family's attorney says it is the first wrongful death settlement from chewing tobacco.

• New research shows long-term use of a daily low-dose aspirin dramatically cuts the risk of dying from a wide array of cancers, including gastrointestinal, stomach, colorectal, lung and prostate cancers.

• A US Airways plane bound for Phoenix had to make an emergency landing in Pittsburgh on Monday after a small dog jumped out of its cage and bit a passenger and a flight attendant.

• Elizabeth Edwards, the estranged wife of presidential hopeful Sen. John Edwards, died Tuesday at her N.C. home at age 61.
