

State & Local News

◆ MARCHING AGAINST METH

Another March Against Meth will be held tomorrow. This time, concerned citizens will gather at the Englewood Park near the pool at 8 a.m. They will march into downtown Englewood carrying signs supporting the fight against meth in McMinn County. More than 70 people took place in marches in Niota last Saturday and in Riceville the Saturday before that. Marches are also scheduled for April 9th in Etowah and April 16th in Athens. Rev. Jerry Shirk, pastor of the Knoxville Avenue Baptist Church, is the organizer of the marches.

A group of Monroe County pastors and their congregations will meet at 1 p.m. tomorrow at the Monroe County Courthouse to show their concerns about the meth epidemic. The group will also be praying that the Ten Commandments will be posted in all Tennessee courthouses.

◆ HOMEWARD BOUND!

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ Two senior Libyan officials have resigned, indicating that the Gadhafi regime may be cracking from within. The foreign minister and Libya's representative to the U.N. both said they are quitting. Meantime, Libyan government troops knocked rebels back for a third straight day on Thursday.

◆ Officials with the company that operates Japan's stricken nuclear plant say radioactive contamination in the groundwater underneath one of the reactors has been measured at 10,000 times the government health standard. Officials say they do not believe any drinking water supply is affected, but some of the contaminated water has already leaked into the ocean.

◆ A Wisconsin judge has forced Governor Scott Walker to halt plans to implement a law that would strip most public workers of their collective bargaining rights and cut their pay. The judge's order blocks implementation of the law while she considers a challenge to its legitimacy.

◆ New statistics show smoking causes a half-million deaths each year in the U.S., killing slightly more men than women.

◆ A survey of 1,500 churches across the nation shows donations increased at 43% of them last year and went down at 39%.
