### STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

#### ◆ HUBBLE TO BECOME SUPERINTENDENT

Rev. Mike Hubble, former pastor of Keith Memorial United Methodist Church in Athens, has been named superintendent of the Methodist denomination's Chattanooga District effective in June. Hubble was pastor at Keith from 2002 to 2009. He has served as superintendent of the Abingdon District since 2009.

#### ◆ CROSSWALK REMINDER

The Athens Public Works Department has issued a reminder to motorists about the crosswalks on city streets and, especially, the TWC crosswalk on Green Street. The lights at that crosswalk are mechanical devices and have the potential to fail during storms or power outages. You should use extreme caution when you approach the crosswalk. Always look for students on the side of the crosswalk and do not rely only on the lights on the road surface.

#### ◆ CALL BEFORE YOU DIG

Governor Bill Haslam has proclaimed April as Tennessee Safe Digging Month. Athens Utilities Board reminds you to call 811 before starting any project that involves digging. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says it is important to call 811 even if you are simply setting a new mailbox, building a deck, or digging a flower bed.

### NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ Numerous trees and limbs were downed during last night's storms. Callers to the 911 center reported seeing funnel clouds on County Road 558. Several power outages and wrecks were reported.

◆ Former Tennessee Governor Ned Ray McWherter died Monday at age 80 from cancer. McWherter served as governor from 1987-1995. (See an official photo of Gov. McWherter on page 2)

◆ Libyan rebels have regained control of half of Brega, a strategic oil town that has repeatedly changed hands in several weeks of battles with Moammar Gadhafi's forces.

◆ Khalid Sheikh Mohammed, the self-professed mastermind of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks, will be tried by a military commission at Guantanamo Bay instead of in a U.S. civilian court. President Obama has tried unsuccessfully to transfer Mohammed to a U.S. prison and try him in a federal court.

◆ Southwest Airlines officials have confirmed that tiny cracks have been found in three more 737 jetliners. The cracks are similar to those suspected of causing a 5-foot-long section of fuselage to rip from the roof of a Southwest Airlines plane last Friday. Following that incident, Southwest grounded its 79 other 737's and began inspecting them. Those inspections are expected to be completed today.

**THIS DAY IN HISTORY-APRIL 5**  
**1614** - Pocahontas married John Rolfe on this date. Pocahontas was the daughter of an American Indian chief. Rolfe was one of the English settlers in Jamestown, Virginia.  
**1827** - Sir Joseph Lister, an English surgeon, was born. He revolutionized surgery by using antiseptics on hands, instruments, and dressings. Before that, nearly 50% of all surgical cases ended in death because of infections.  
**1856** - Booker T. Washington was born. He was the first principal of Tuskegee Institute, a school for blacks in Alabama. During his 34 years there, it grew from a school of two buildings and 40 students to an institute of over 100 buildings, a faculty of 200, and 1,500 students.  
**1887** - In Tuscumbia, Ala., teacher Anne Sullivan taught her blind and deaf pupil, Helen Keller, the meaning of the word "water" as spelled out in the manual alphabet.
