STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

◆ CIVIL WAR REMEMBERED AT MUSEUM

Today marks the 150th anniversary of the start of the Civil War. (See Almanac on page 2) The McMinn Living Heritage Museum staged a Civil War era Calvary display on Sunday afternoon that was well attended. Re-enactors portrayed the various roles. NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Libyan rebels, backed forcefully by European leaders, rejected a cease-fire proposal by African mediators on Monday because it did not insist that Moammar Gadhafi relinquish power.
- ◆ Another strong earthquake with a preliminary magnitude of 6.3 has jolted Tokyo and the areas that surround it.
- ◆ An explosion tore through a key subway station in the Belarusian capital of Minsk during evening rush hour Monday killing 11 people and wounding 126. An official said the blast was a terrorist act.
- ◆ Former Massachusetts Gov. Mitt Romney, the closest to a front-runner in a wide-open Republican field, took a major step toward a second White House candidacy Monday, formally announcing a campaign exploratory committee.
- ◆ Stocks closed little changed on Monday after the International Monetary Fund cut its estimate for U.S. economic growth. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed at 12,381.11; up 1.06.
- ◆ The NFL and its locked-out players have been ordered by a judge to start talking again.
- ◆ The company that owns the Applebee's restaurant chain said it was immediately retraining its workers nationwide after a server at a suburban Detroit location accidentally served alcohol to a 15 month-old-toddler instead of apple juice.
