STATE AND LOCAL NEWS

◆ ENGLEWOOD MAN SENTENCED TO 135 MONTHS

Mark Allen Buckner, 41, was sentenced yesterday in Federal Court as a result of a guilty plea by Buckner on a federal charge of conspiracy to manufacture meth. Buckner was pulled-over in July 2010 for a traffic stop and a search turned-up marijuana and a box of pseudoephedrine purchased at a drug store. Buckner admitted the pills were going to be used to make meth. On September 3, 2010 McMinn Deputies were dispatched to Buckner's residence after receiving a report of a suicide there. Officers also discovered a large meth lab. Buckner was featured on a National Geographic TV special about meth, after he received burns over 60% of his body from a meth lab explosion. After a lengthy stay at Vanderbilt's burn unit, Buckner was released and began cooking meth again, which prompted the federal charges and subsequent guilty plea.

◆ ELECTRICITY RATES TO RISE SLIGHTLY

Athens Utilities Board says power rates for their customers will increase slightly in December. The December rate for a kilowatt hour of electricity will be about 8.7 cents, up from 8.3 cents in November. AUB says the increase is due to a combination of TVA's seasonal rate schedule and TVA's December fuel cost adjustment. Meanwhile, Athens Utilities Board will be working on Highway 39 near Englewood today and the work will require a lengthy power outage in the area of Highway 39 near the new Rogers Group rock quarry. Customers on Highway 39 and County Roads 464, 466, 467, 469, 470, and 477 will be without power from 9 a.m. until sometime in the afternoon.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

◆ The U.S. Supreme Court says it will hear a challenge to the Obama health care reform law this term. The court will hear arguments next March and will probably issue a decision in late June, about four months before election day.

◆ American Eagle Airlines has become the first airline to be slapped with fines for violating the Transportation Department's three-hour limit for tarmac delays. On May 29th of this year, 15 American Eagle flights left a total of 608 passengers sitting on the tarmac at Chicago's O'Hare International Airport for a total of 225 minutes. The airline received a fine of \$900,000.

◆ Gloria Cain, wife of Republican presidential hopeful Herman Cain, has broken her silence about the sexual harassment allegations against her husband. Mrs. Cain says she cannot see her husband doing the things that have been described by some of his accusers. She says she knows the type of person her husband is and that he "totally respects women."

◆ Stock prices dropped on Monday as fears of a euro zone recession continue. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed down 74.70 at 12,078.98.

◆ The daughter of Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and former President Bill Clinton--Chelsea Clinton--has been hired as a special correspondent for NBC Nightly News and "Rock Center."
