Local & State News

◆ STEAM LOCOMOTIVE CHUGS ALONG

Many folks in McMinn County got a rare treat Monday afternoon when a genuine steam locomotive chugged down the railroad tracks. The Southern 630 is owned by the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum in Chattanooga. It was making its first long distance trip after being refurbished. The train pulled four passenger cars on a oneway fan trip from Knoxville to Chattanooga. The passengers paid a round trip fare and were bussed back to Knoxville after their arrival in Chattanooga. NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ Hundreds of police officers in riot gear evicted hundreds of Occupy Wall Street demonstrators in New York City early Tuesday and demolished their tent city. Mayor Bloomberg ordered the sweep because of "intolerable" health and safety conditions. Police arrested around 200 people in the process.

◆ Two national polls released this week show former House Speaker Newt Gingrich surging to double digits in the Republican presidential race. A Public Policy Polling survey shows Gingrich in the lead, 10 points ahead of Mitt Romney. A CNN poll puts Gingrich in a statistical dead heat with Romney. Gingrich's rise comes at the expense of Herman Cain.

◆ Former Penn State assistant football coach Jerry Sandusky has broken his silence on the charges of child molestation against him. Sandusky says he is not sexually attracted to young boys. He says he merely "horsed around" with kids and showered with them after workouts. He admitted he has hugged young boys and touched their legs, but says there was no intent of sexual contact.

◆ Stocks prices were up Tuesday as investors welcomed strong economic data on retail sales. The Dow Jones Industrial Average closed up 17.18 at 12,096.16.
