Local & State News

◆ **UNCLE SAM HELPS PUT FOOD ON THE TABLE**

Uncle Sam helped put food on the table for one in every six households in Tennessee on Thanksgiving day. A new study shows Tennessee ranks second in the nation in the percentage of families receiving food stamps. Seventeen percent of the residents of Tennessee got food stamps last year. That's higher than any other state in the south, and second only to the state of Oregon.

◆ **CLARIFICATION ON BURN STORY**

In last Friday's Morning Fax, we reported that a 22-year-old woman in the Claxton community suffered gasoline burns during a domestic dispute with her brother. Sheriff Joe Guy says the initial call came in as a domestic dispute and deputies temporarily detained one person. However, they soon determined there was no domestic dispute and that it was clearly an accident. Sheriff Guy says the woman was handed a cup that she thought contained diesel fuel to use to start a fire in the fireplace. The cup actually contained gasoline, which burst into flames. The woman dropped the burning cup onto the floor, then picked it up and tossed it into the kitchen sink. She suffered severe burns to her hands and was treated at the burn center in Augusta, Georgia.

NATIONAL-WORLD NEWS

◆ New Hampshire's largest newspaper has endorsed former House Speaker Newt Gingrich in the 2012 GOP presidential race, signaling that rival Mitt Romney isn't the universal favorite; potentially resetting the contest before the state's lead-off primary Jan. 10.

◆ Egypt's military ruler warned of "extremely grave" consequences if the turbulent nation does not pull through its current crisis and urged voters to turn out for landmark parliamentary elections starting today.

◆ Afghan troops who came under fire while operating near the Pakistan border called in the NATO airstrikes that allegedly killed 24 Pakistani soldiers at two posts along the frontier, Afghan officials admitted.

◆ The Arab League has overwhelmingly approved sanctions against Syria to pressure Damascus to end its deadly eight-month crackdown on dissent, an unprecedented move by the League against another Arab state.

◆ Embattled Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker may not face a recall vote until next summer, but he's already campaigning to keep his job in the face of a major challenge by organized labor and the Democratic Party.
