National & International News

- ◆ Senate Republicans blocked a bill on Wednesday that would boost the federal minimum wage. Republicans claimed it would be too expensive for employers and eliminate thousands of jobs.
- ◆ Thin sheets of scaffolding-like material from pigs were implanted into a few young men with disabling leg injuries. The experimental treatment coaxed the men's own stem cells to regrow new muscle.
- ◆ Girls and young women kidnapped from a school in Nigeria are being forced to marry their Islamic extremist abductors. A civic watchdog organization reported the findings recently.
- ◆ A CSX Corp train carrying crude oil derailed and burst into flames in downtown Lynchburg, Virginia on Wednesday forcing hundreds to evacuate within a half-mile radius. The oil spilled into the James River. Officials said there were no injuries.
- ◆ After a shooting at a sawmill in British Columbia on Wednesday, four people were taken to a hospital and the suspect is in custody. It is unknown if the suspect is one of the injured. The sawmill is operated by Western Forest Products.
- ◆ Al Feldstein, who transformed the satirical publication of Mad Magazine into a pop culture institution, has died at the age of 88.
