Local and State News

◆ COMMUNITY NEWS YOU CAN USE:

- ✓ This summer, the E.G. Fisher Public Library will be one of the locations where children can have lunch for free! The Athens City Schools is providing lunch for children each Monday through July 21. You can bring your children to the library between 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m., where they can enjoy lunch and a children's program.
- ✓ Etowah is gearing up for its Old Fashioned 4th of July celebration. The event kicks off with the Independence Dash-5K Run/Walk sponsored by the First Baptist Church Track Club. The Boy Scouts will be on hand that morning to serve up their famous pancakes. Lots of entertainment will be scheduled throughout the day, including the beauty pageant and the old fashioned games. The headline act for this year's event will be Southern Drawl, and the evening will culminate with a fireworks show.
- ✓ June is Amateur Radio Month at the McMinn Living Heritage Museum. The Museum and the McMinn County Amateur Radio Club are teaming up to make a display of vintage to modern amateur radio equipment available for viewing beginning this Saturday. Also this Saturday, Heritage School will give you an opportunity to learn about the McMinn County Amateur Radio Club from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- ✓ The Tennessee Overhill Heritage Association announces the release of the "Battle of Athens" map of August 1-2, 1946. The map gives the locations of significant events during the battle.

NATIONAL & WORLD NEWS

- ◆ Arrica Wallace was riddled with tumors two years ago, from widely spread cervical cancer. The strongest chemotherapy and radiation could not beat it back. Today, Wallace shows no signs of the disease, and it was her own immune system that made it go away. The cervical cancer experiment was the first time an immune therapy has worked so dramatically against a cancer caused by the HPV virus. Doctors are trying it now against other cancers caused by HPV, the human papillomavirus. They believe it holds promise for cancers caused by other viruses as well.
- ◆ Hundreds of pro-Russia rebels armed with automatic weapons and rocket-propelled grenades have mounted a daylong assault on a key government base used to coordinate the defense of the Ukrainian border with Russia, prompting the deployment of air support by Ukrainian forces.
- ◆ The Pentagon concluded in 2010 that Army Sgt. Bowe Bergdahl walked away from and deserted his unit, and after an initial flurry of searching, the military curbed any high-risk rescue plans. But the U.S. kept pursuing avenues to negotiate his release, recently seeking to fracture the Taliban network by making its leaders fear a faster deal with underlings could prevent the freedom they sought for five of their top terrorist officials, who were being held by the U.S. in Cuba.
- ◆ King Juan Carlos, who led Spain's transition from dictatorship to democracy, says he will abdicate in favor of his more popular son so that fresh royal blood can rally the nation.

TODAY IN HISTORY - June 3rd

- 1808** - Jefferson Davis, president of the Confederacy, was born in Kentucky.
- 1927** - Saxophone player Boots Randolph was born.
- 1937** - The Duke of Windsor, formerly King Edward the 8th of Great Britain, married a divorced American woman, Mrs. Wallis Warfield Simpson. He had given up the throne for the marriage because his government said it would not allow the woman to become queen.
- 1946** - The U.S. Supreme Court ruled that segregation of blacks and whites on buses was unconstitutional.
- 1959** - The first class to graduate from the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO did so on this day.
- 1965** - Astronaut Ed White became the first American to make a "walk" in space. He was attached to a "tether."
- 2011** - Physician-assisted suicide advocate Dr. Jack Kevorkian died at a Michigan hospital at age 83.
