### State & Local News

#### ◆ FITZPATRICK GUILTY ON TWO COUNTS

Retired Navy Commander Walter Fitzpatrick has been found guilty of two felonies. The McMinn County jury began deliberations Tuesday morning and returned its verdict later in the day. Fitzpatrick was found guilty of extortion and aggravated perjury. He was found not guilty of stalking and harassment. Fitzpatrick was arrested at the McMinn County Courthouse in March on four charges stemming from allegations that he harassed and stalked a grand jury foreman.

#### ◆ MAYOR BUTTRAM IS "MAYOR OF THE YEAR"

Athens Mayor Hal Buttram was named the 2014 Mayor of the Year by the Tennessee Municipal League at their annual conference in Chattanooga. Mayor Buttram was recognized for his strong focus on education, jobs creation, and recruitment of new industries to Athens. The photo shows Mayor Buttram and his wife, Susan. Buttram was elected to the Athens City Council in 2006 and was chosen mayor in 2008.



### National & International News

◆ Next month the House will vote on legislation authorizing a campaign-season lawsuit accusing President Obama of failing to carry out the laws passed by Congress, according to Speaker John Boehner. In a memo distributed to House members, Boehner accused Obama of "aggressive unilateralism" and said if left unchecked, it would give the president "king-like authority at the expense of the American people and their elected legislators."

◆ U.S. Rep. Charles Rangel moved one step closer to what he says will be his 23rd and final term in the House after defeating state Sen. Adriano Espaillat in Wednesday's Democratic primary.

◆ Fabien Cousteau, who has been living underwater for the past few weeks in the Florida Keys, has a week left in his 31-day underwater living experience. Cousteau is leading a project called Mission 31 which aims to build awareness about the need to protect the ocean, and is also studying the effects of climate change and pollutants such as fertilizers on the reef. Cousteau is the grandson of famous explorer Jacques Cousteau. The undersea habitat is about the size of a school bus and encrusted with coral and includes living quarters for six people.

◆ As Lebanese security forces raided the premises at a Beirut hotel, a suicide bomber killed himself.
