UNEMPLOYMENT DROPS SLIGHTLY

The unemployment rate for McMinn County dropped a bit in October, falling from 5.8% in September to 5.7% in October. Meigs County's rate dropped from 7% in September to 6.4% in October. Monroe County's jobless rate held steady at 5.5% both months.

• Beware of another email scam disguised as a delivery notice. These scam emails generally appear to be from FedEx, DHL Express, UPS or the U.S. Postal Service. Many of these emails will say that there was a failed delivery and ask you to follow a link or download an attachment for more information. These links or attachments could contain a virus or other malware. Do not open these attachments and delete the email immediately.

◆ Wall Street closed mixed Tuesday despite another record high for the Dow and a rally in oil prices. The Dow gained 39.58 to close at 19,796.43. The Nasdaq gave up 31.96 to close at 5,412.54, and the S&P 500 finished down 2.57 to close at 2,256.96. Crude oil jumped nearly 2 percent with prices hitting over \$53 a barrel after a new deal to reduce output by top oil producers was announced.

TODAY IN HISTORY, DECEMBER 13th

1577 - Sir Francis Drake sailed from England to begin his voyage around the world.

1835 - Preacher Phillips Brooks was born on this date. He wrote the Christmas carol "O Little Town of Bethlehem."

1862 - Confederate forces dealt Union troops a major defeat at the Battle of Fredericksburg in Virginia.

1887 - Sergeant Alvin York was born in Pall Mall, Tennessee. During World War One, he led an attack on a German machinegun nest and almost singlehandedly killed 25 of the enemy and captured 132 prisoners and 35 machineguns. He was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.

1918 - President Woodrow Wilson arrived in France to attend the post-World War I peace conference at Versailles, becoming the first chief executive to visit Europe while in office.

1941 - Singer John Davidson was born.

1949 - Singer Randy Owen of Alabama was born.

1981 - Authorities in Poland imposed martial law in a crackdown on the Solidarity labor movement.

2001 - The Pentagon released a captured videotape of Osama bin Laden in which the al-Qaida leader said the deaths and destruction achieved by the September 11th attacks exceeded his "most optimistic" expectations.

2003 - Ousted Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein was captured by U.S. forces while hiding in a hole under a farmhouse in Adwar, near his hometown of Tikrit.
