#### ◆ CITY MANAGER CANDIDATE INTERVIEWS BEGIN

Interviews with the finalists for the position of Athens City Manager are about to begin. The Athens City Council will meet in a called session Wednesday, Dec. 28th, at 4 p.m. at the Municipal Building. The first interview will be with C. Seth Sumner. He is the assistant city manager of Savannah, Tennessee, and has also served as the city manager of Clifton, Tennessee.

### ◆ PROF POWERS PARK IS STILL CLOSED

Prof Powers Park remains closed for repairs caused by the recent tornado. Among other things, the tornado's winds damaged the pavillion beyond repair. It has been torn down and will be rebuilt.

#### ◆ NEW YEAR'S SCHEDULE FOR ATHENS

In observance of New Year's, the Athens Municipal Building, Public Works Department, Recycle Center, and Animal Shelter will be closed next Monday, January 2nd. The only residential garbage route to be affected will be the Monday, January 2nd, schedule which will be picked up on Tuesday. If you plan to pay your city property taxes before the end of the year, City Hall will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day this week. Only tax payments received by 5 p.m. Friday or postmarked by midnight Dec. 31 will be marked as paid in 2016.

#### THIS DAY IN HISTORY-December 27

**1822 -** French scientist Louis Pasteur was born. He invented the process of pasteurization to preserve milk and other foods. **1845 -** Dr. Crawford Williamson Long used anesthesia for child-birth for the first time, when he delivered his own child in Jefferson, Georgia.

**1900** - Carrie Nation staged her first raid on a saloon at the Carey Hotel in Wichita, Kansas. She broke every one of the liquor bottles in sight. Nation usually did her damage with a hatchet; calling her vandalism, hatchetation.

**1927 -** The Jerome Kern and Oscar Hammerstein II musical, "Show Boat" debuted in New York City. Its star, Helen Morgan, received excellent reviews from critics of the show, a musical about riverboat show people and their romances and disappointments.

**1947** - "Hey kids... What time is it? It's Howdy Doody time!" Buffalo Bob (Smith), Clarabelle the Clown (Bob Keeshan), Judy Canova and a host of others joined "Howdy Doody" for the show's debut on NBC-TV. The show stayed on the air for 13 years.

**1968** - The Apollo-8 astronauts returned to earth after orbiting the moon 10 times. The mission paved the way for later moonlanding missions.
