♦ DAVIS TO BE INTERIM POLICE CHIEF

Captain Rob Davis will serve as interim police chief of Athens until a permanent replacement for retiring Chief Chuck Ziegler is named. Ziegler is one of three long-time Athens City employees who are retiring at the end of the year. Human Resources Director Rita Brown and City Manager Mitch Moore wrap up their work this week. In-person interviews with the finalists for the city manager position are under way.

National & World News

- ◆ The Times Square New Year's Eve crystal ball is just about ready to help ring in 2017, and at exactly one minute before midnight on New Year's Eve, the ball will begin its descent down a specially designed pole. This year's version of the crystal ball weighs close to 12,000 pounds, is 12 feet in diameter, and is covered by 2,688 crystal triangles and illuminated by more than 32,000 LED lights in different colors.
- ◆ Christian Gutierrez, a 19-year-old college student, accused of killing several Laysan albatross at a Hawaii nature reserve, pleaded not guilty Tuesday to animal cruelty. The Laysan albatross is a federally protected species. Gutierrez turned himself in to the Hawaii Department of Public Safety last week. He made arrangements with prosecutors to surrender while he was home in Honolulu for winter break from school. Gutierrez attends New York University.
- ◆German authorities have detained a 40-year-old Tunisian man who "could have been involved in the attack" on a Christmas market in Berlin.
- ◆The Obama Administration is expected to announce sometime Thursday the retaliatory steps it plans to take against Russia for the alleged cyber-assault that may have impacted the U.S. presidential election.
- Amazon.com Inc. shipped more than one billion items through Amazon Prime as well as its fulfillment services according to Bloomberg.com. Bloomberg also reports the company also setting sales records for its own Alexa device.

Some of 2016's Biggest News Stories

The year 2016 began in McMinn County on January 1st with the birth of the year's first baby, Henley Kate Presley, and ended with the tornado that tore a 10-mile-long path through Athens in the early morning hours of November 30th.

There was a lot of news in between

- Death claimed businessman Nat Moore, pharmacist Jack Wallace, and author and speaker Nell Mohney. Longtime pastor and teacher Oran Creasman died several days after being injured in a car wreck near Riceville.
- Tennessee Wesleyan College became Tennessee Wesleyan University.
- Barry Willis was named "Man of the Year" at the Athens Area Chamber of Commerces Annual Awards Banquet in January.
- The Etowah Area Chamber of Commerce presented the R. Frank McKinney Distinguished Service Award to Marilyn Joiner, president of The Friends of the Library.
- Athens voters defeated a 3/4% increase in the local sales tax in a referendum in March.
- Keith Harris Taylor, 51, was shot to death by two males who came into an apartment on Forrest Avenue and started shooting on January 6th. So far, Athens police have not made any arrests
