◆ ATHENS CITY COUNCIL PASSES BUDGET

It was a busy Tuesday night for the Athens City Council. The Council passed a balanced budget that does not contain any tax increase. The vote was unanimous. The Council also presented the VIVID (Very Important Volunteer Individual) Award to Athens City Middle School for it's Annual Day of Caring. A distinguished service award was presented to postal worker Zack Walker for helping to save a family from flood waters in May.

Interim Police Chief Rob Davis reported there were 74 thefts in Athens in May, 18 assaults, 12 burglaries, and 8 motor vehicle thefts. Officers issued 394 citations for moving violations. There were 68 traffic accidents in the city in May, with 11 injuries. Davis says there are three vacancies on the police force.

Athens Fire Chief Jim Dyer reported that firefighters responded to 44 calls during May. One was to an industrial fire, one was a vehicle fire, five were calls to vehicle accidents, and there were 11 false alarms. Losses for the month totaled \$751,000. Of that amount, \$750,000 in damage was done by an electrical fire at the H.P. Pelzer plant at 115 Industrial Way on May 21st.
