◆ NTSB ISSUES REPORT ON PLANE CRASH

The National Transportation Safety Board has issued its preliminary report on the plane crash that killed an Etowah couple and two children near Chatsworth, GA, on July 1st. The NTSB says Dexter Lee Gresham and Mary Jo Yarbrough and Yarbrough's two 10-year-old grandchildren were returning home to the McMinn County Airport after a week-long trip to Alabama. The report says Gresham was not receiving radar information and was not in communication with air traffic control at the time of the crash. Their twin-engine plane flew into a thunderstorm and broke apart. Gresham was not instrument-rated, meaning he was not qualified to fly a plane in bad weather. The report says problems apparently began before the plane took off in Alabama. It says

Gresham was not able to get the engines to start. but declined an offer from a technician to help. After charging the plane's batteries for a few hours, the plane was able to take off. It crashed about 200 miles later. The NTSB will release a final report



once the investigation is complete.

National - World News

- ◆ Britain's High Court has given Charlie Gard's family until noon Thursday to agree with Great Ormond Street Hospital on how the infant should be cared for before his death. Yesterday, the family asked a U.K. court for permission to let the child die at home. Charlie's rare illness has damaged his brain and rendered him unable to breathe on his own.
- ◆ A U.S. Navy ship fired multiple warning shots at an Iranian vessel in the Persian Gulf that came within 150 yards of the American ship. After warning shots were fired, the Iranian craft halted its approach.
- ◆ According to the U.S. Department of Justice, a California man has been arrested on a federal smuggling charge stemming from the seizure of a package that contained three live king cobras hidden inside potato chip canisters.


