♦ HAULING RELIEF AID TO PUERTO RICO

Captain Jon Ketchersid, son of Morning Fax editor Bob Ketchersid and a graduate of McMinn High School, flew this FedEx plane to San Juan, Puerto Rico, last Friday to deliver food and water to Hurricane Maria victims. FedEx has been sending three planeloads of supplies daily. Jon says tons of supplies are stacked along the airport tarmac, going undelivered due to a lack of truck drivers. The U.S. Army has sent several trucks and drivers to Puerto Rico to help deliver the food and water. Jon said the airport still does not have electricity. He also said from the air you can see thousands of blue tarps covering houses that had their roofs blown away or heavily damaged.



National & World News

◆ Raging wildfires in Northern California have destroyed at least 1,500 structures and forced the evacuation of 20,000 residents. Two people have died from the fires. Fires are burning across eight counties, including Napa, Sonoma and Yuba. Altogether, 57,000 acres have been devastated.

◆ Cecilia Franco, became the 13th person to die when her nursing home lost air conditioning from Hurricane Irma just weeks after her husband, Miguel Antonio Franco died from the incident. Authorities claim that another patient was confirmed to have died, bringing the total to 14.
