◆ ATHENS MAN STEALS TRUCK, SHOOTS SELF

An Athens man, 27-year-old Cody Arbuthnot, of County Road 1121 is recovering from a gunshot wound and is likely to be charged with vehicular theft after what police are calling a "series of bad decisions." McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy says Arbuthnot had just bonded out at the McMinn County Jail Monday evening when he and his father got into an argument outside the lobby. Sheriff Guy says Arbuthnot became agitated. He saw a black 2002 Chevrolet Avalanche in the Justice Center parking lot, unlocked, with the engine running. Sheriff Guy says he jumped into the vehicle and drove away. Athens Police Chief Cliff Couch says Athens police officers located the truck on Canal Street, with Arbuthnot suffering from a gunshot wound. The truck belonged to Casey Tilley, 19, of Athens. Sheriff Guy says Tilley had gone to the Justice Center to visit his wife who is an inmate there. He not only left the truck running and the door unlocked, but there was a handgun in the truck which Arbuthnot found. Chief Couch says it appears the gunshot wound was self-inflicted, although it was not clear if it was accidental. Arbuthnot was airlifted to a hospital where he is listed in serious condition. Sheriff Guy says Tilley has been banned from any further visits at the Justice Center.
