#### **♦ TODAY IS TENNESSEE "SHAKE OUT" DAY**

Tennessee will be among 14 states in the south and central U.S. to observe the 7th annual Great Central U.S. ShakeOut drill today. The purpose of the drill is to raise awareness about the importance of being prepared for a catastrophic earthquake. The Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA) is working with schools, businesses, communities, and individuals for today's ShakeOut drill so they can learn how to prevent damage and injuries in the event of a major earthquake. The ShakeOut event will begin at 11:15 a.m. At that time, school students and other people are encouraged to DROP to the ground, take COVER under a desk or table, or cover their heads and neck with their arms, and **HOLD ON** until the shaking stops. That is known as the **Drop**, Cover, and Hold On technique. It's been many years since a major earthquake occurred in East Tennessee. However, every year scores of small quakes measuring under 3.0 on the Richter Scale are recorded in our area along a fault line stretching from Georgia and running through East Tennessee. West Tennessee, on the other hand, lies on the New Madrid fault line. Seismologists say it's just a matter of time before another major earthquake strikes that area. On Feb. 7, 1812, an earthquake devastated New Madrid, Missouri. The quake caused a temporary waterfall on the Mississippi River, which sent waves of water across northwestern Tennessee, creating what is now known as Reelfoot Lake.

◆ Radee Labeeb Prince, 37, is in custody after allegedly shooting five people and killing three Wednesday at the Advanced Granite Solutions office in Edgewood, Maryland where he worked. He also shot a sixth person at a car dealership in Delaware, and was captured later by federal agents in Newark, Delaware.
