## TBI ISSUES WARNING ON DRUGS

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation has issued a public warning to recreational drug users after what the TBI calls "troubling" submissions to their drug lab. The TBI says several samples of cocaine submitted by police agencies in East and Middle Tennessee have also tested positive for fentanyl, a powerful narcotic pain killer. This is the first time samples of cocaine have tested positive in a TBI laboratory for fentanyl. In certain doses, fentanyl can be 50 to 100 times as potent as morphine. The drug does not necessarily need to be ingested to have an effect. It can be absorbed through the skin, so touching the substance can quickly put an individual at risk of opioid overdose and death. The TBI is investigating the origins of the submitted drug samples.

## ETOWAH CITY COMMISSION TO MEET

The monthly meeting of the Etowah City Commission will be held tonight at 6:30 at the Etowah Recreation Center on Robinson Street. A group of Etowah citizens will be seeking the resignation of commissioner Roby Helm. A petition is circulating in the city to possibly hold a recall of Commissioner Helm.

## - CALHOUN HOLDS CITY ELECTION

An election was held for a single city commission seat last Thursday for the City of Calhoun. The winner was James Duffy, who received $54 \%$ of the vote while his opponent, Jon Eaves, received $46 \%$. A total of 87 people cast a ballot in the election.

## National \& World News

A Norfolk Southern freight train derailed Saturday night in North Knoxville. It struck several buildings. The train had 3 locomotives and 68 railcars of which 20 tumbled off the track. No injuries were reported. The train was not carrying any hazardous materials when it derailed.

- The United States Air Force could recall as many as 1,000 retired military pilots to active-duty service to address an acute shortage in its ranks. President Trump signed an executive order Friday allowing the Air Force to call back to service up to 1,000 retired aviation officers who wish to return. At the end of 2016 the USAF was short 1,555 pilots.
- Police in Florida are searching for whoever is "terrorizing" a Tampa neighborhood after three people were shot and killed in the same vicinity in less than two weeks. The latest slaying occurred Thursday night when Anthony Naiboa, a 20-year-old man with autism, was killed while on his way home from work, according to the Tampa Police Department.
