♦ MOVE TO OUST AN ETOWAH OFFICIAL

There's a move underway in Etowah to oust City Commissioner Roby Helm. At Monday night's Etowah City Commission meeting, Helm said he will not resign. He was responding to Etowah resident and businesswoman, Cat Pate, who accused Helm of making sexually harassing comments toward her on Facebook. Helm said his comments were not meant to be sexual, and he apologized in a Facebook group. Pate said she wasn't able to see that apology because she is banned from that Facebook group, and that Helm knew it. She said if it was a genuine apology, he would have called her. Mayor Gene Kelley said he does not believe the comments were sexual, but said he thinks Helm owes Pate an apology, face-to-face. Pate has said she would initiate a recall petition if Helm did not resign at Monday night's meeting.

◆ Five teenage boys in Michigan could face life in prison if convicted of second-degree murder for allegedly throwing a rock at a van that went through the windshield and killed 32 year old Kenneth White who was a passenger in the van. The teens made their first court appearance on Tuesday facing charges of conspiracy to commit murder and malicious destruction of property. About 20 rocks were found strewn on the highway.

◆ McMINN INDUSTRIAL SITE IS CERTIFIED

Four industrial sites in Tennessee will receive help from the state to make them more attractive to companies looking to expand of relocate. One of those is the new 75 Regional Commerce Park in north McMinn County. Department of Economic and Community Development officials say the Select Tennessee Certified Sites program helps communities prepare available industrial sites for private investment. The 75 Regional Commerce Park consists of 144 acres of developable land and has electrical, natural gas, and water service.

TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks were higher helped by a number of positive earnings reports.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 168 points or 0.7% to 23,442. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 4 points or 0.2% to 2,569, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 12 points or 0.2% to 6,598. In bond markets, the 30-year Treasury closed higher at 2.94%, and the 10-year Treasury yield finished higher at 2.42%. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold fell \$5.19 to \$1,277.05, and the price of crude oil rose \$0.55 to \$52.45.
