EARLY SNOW TURNS ATHENS WHITE

The forecast called for a chance of light snow in the Athens area last Friday, but by mid-day the snow was falling steadily. The McMinn County Schools sent students home at 1:30 p.m. A little over a half-inch of snow fell around the area, and the roads stayed clear except for some bridges. Heavier snow fell in Monroe and Polk Counties and in north Georgia. As a result of the snow, the ACT tests on Saturday at McMinn High and Central High were cancelled. ◆ About 4500 portable generators are being recalled due to a fire hazard. The recall involves Westinghouse IGen2500 and IPro2500 Portable Inverter Generators.

◆ The U.S. Treasury Department reportedly paid \$220,000 to settle a lawsuit brought by a former congressional staffer alleging sexual harassment by Rep. Alcee Hastings, a Florida Democrat.

◆ Eye doctors in New York say Nia Payne's vision was permanently damaged when she borrowed a pair of eclipse glasses to look at the solar eclipse this past August. The sun's rays damaged her retina, causing a crescent-shaped blind spot in the center of her left eye. Doctors say the blind spot matched the shape of the partial eclipse she was looking at.
