NIOTA MAN DIES IN STABBING INCIDENT

A McMinn County man has passed away after being stabbed in a

domestic argument near Niota on Monday evening. According to Sheriff Joe Guy, Raymond D. McDermott, 55, was found dead at the scene of a domestic dispute at his residence on County Road 162 near Niota around 10:30 p.m. Monday night. Deputies and detectives investigated. Based upon evidence and witness statements from the family members present, it was determined that Mr. McDermott had become involved in a physical altercation with his stepson, Jules O. Moore, 33, (in photo) of the same residence. "It appears that the altercation turned violent," said Sheriff Joe Guy, "Mr. McDermott sustained two stab wounds and died as



a result of his injuries." Moore was booked into the McMinn Co. Jail on 2nd Degree Murder charges, where he remains under a \$100,000 bond. Sheriff Guy said the investigation is continuing.

◆ Nashville Mayor Megan Barry has resigned after pleading



guilty to theft of property charges. She will pay \$11,000 in restitution and serve three years' probation. The resignation comes less than five weeks after Barry admitted to a two-year affair with her police bodyguard.

◆ A mother and her 7-year-old son were found buried under 3 feet of snow near the front door of their California vacation condo on Monday. They were discovered unconscious under a mound of snow more than two hours after they were reported missing. Authorities believe a pile of snow slid from the roof and buried them as they were returning from an afternoon ski run. Both of them died a short while later in a nearby hospital.
