◆ DENSO WINS VOLUNTEER STARS AWARD

The Athens DENSO plant is the recipient of the 2017 Governor's Volunteer Stars Business award for East Tennessee. Each year, DENSO sends over 100 employees to participate in United Way's Day of Caring. DENSO is also actively involved with Habitat for Humanity. When the wildfires hit the Great Smoky Mountains, they sold "Smoky Strong" t-shirts to raise money to benefit the victims. When a tornado struck McMinn County, they immediately jumped in and helped the United Way organize a disaster relief center. They then formed teams of employees to go out and aid with the clean-up and recovery effort. The Governor's Volunteer Stars Awards include 101 volunteers from 57 counties, along with one business and one non-profit from each of Tennessee's three Grand Regions for their outstanding community involvement and service. Two individuals from McMinn County were honored. Mary Brown was recognized for coordinating the relief efforts following the November 2016 tornado. She was also recognized for bringing the Remote Area Medical (RAM) Clinic to Athens last summer. The McMinn County Youth honoree is Haden Blair, who leads exercise classes for senior citizens each Saturday morning. He is also a member of the Youth Health Task Force in McMinn County and teaches tobacco prevention in area schools. The awards will be presented by Miss Tennessee, Caty Davis, on March 11th in Franklin.


