♦ AS SPRING ARRIVES, POWER RATES FALL

There's some good news for AUB customers. Local power rates for April will drop by about 4.4% compared to March. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough says the decrease comes as a result of a lower monthly fuel charge from TVA and a move from wintertime base rates to transition-season base rates. Scarbrough says now is the time of year when energy use is typically at an annual low.

♦ McMINN GETS SITE DEVELOPMENT GRANT

McMinn County will receive one of 25 site development grants from the Tennessee Community Development Commission. The McMinn County Economic Development Authority will receive \$879,675, which will be used to complete the engineering design for a new access road at the North Etowah Industrial Park. Monroe County will receive \$500,000 to complete site grading at the Niles Ferry Industrial Park. The Site Development Grant program is part of the Rural Economic Opportunity Act passed in 2016. The grants are intended to help rural communities with infrastructure and engineering work on certified industrial park sites.
