#### ◆ FIRE CHIEF DYER SUBMITS RESIGNATION

Athens Fire Chief Jim Dyer has submitted his resignation effective in August. Chief Dyer has accepted a position in the Knoxville area, located about 10 minutes from his home. Dyer has been chief since 2008, coming to Athens from the Oak Ridge Fire Department.



#### MOSES JOINS PARKS DEPARTMENT

Greg Moses, former editor of the Daily Post-Athenian, has a new job. He has been hired to be assistant to Athens Parks and Recreation Director Austin Fesmire. Moses had been a member of the DPA staff since 2007 and was named editor in April of 2017.

◆ MEIGS COUNTY MAN RESCUED FROM FIRE Quick action by a Meigs County volunteer firefighter likely saved a man's life. Firefighter Michael Arp heard over his radio that a house on Warren Lane was on fire with a disabled person inside. Arp went straight to the house and used a small fire extinguisher to battle the fire. He had no time to wait for others to respond with protective gear. Arp managed to reach the 67-year-old man who relies on a walker. Arp had to drag him from the couch to the front door to get him away from the fire.

## National & World News

◆ President Donald Trump is set to attend NATO meetings in Brussels on Wednesday and Thursday with leaders of all 29 member nations.

◆ Rescue attempts are underway by the U.S. Coast Guard for 11 people after their charter plane crashed into a mountain Tuesday afternoon near Ketchikan, Alaska. All passengers on board are alive, but some were injured in the crash. The plane has been located, and they are trying to determine the best way to extract the survivors.

• A family of five in Delaware, including three children under the age of 7, died in a "murder-suicide by gunshot." Police say that Matthew Edwards, 42, gunned down his wife and three kids then shot himself.

♦ On Monday, an American tourist was accidentally shot and killed during a drive-by shooting while exiting a taco restaurant in an upscale neighborhood in Mexico City. The female victim was struck when two men on a motorcycle fired at a man on the side-walk, but hit her.

### **Fugitive Captured**

An investigation by Special Agents with the Tennessee Bu-



reau of Investigation, the Sweetwater Police Department, and the coordinated intelligence efforts of multiple other agencies has resulted in the arrest of a fugitive who has eluded capture for the last decade. In September 2007, at the request of former 10<sup>th</sup> District Attorney General Steve Bebb, TBI Special Agents began investigating the theft of money from the evidence room at the Christopher A. Greene (source) TBI Sweetwater Police Department. During the

course of the investigation, Agents developed information that Christopher A. Greene, who was employed as an officer at the time, was responsible for the theft.

In April 2008, a Monroe County Grand Jury returned an indictment charging Greene with one count of Theft over \$10,000. While attempting to locate Greene, Agents developed information that he had left the country and was possibly living in Central America.

Last week, authorities in Panama located 55-year-old Christopher Greene and alerted the U.S. Marshals Service. On Friday, Greene was returned to the United States and transported back to Tennessee by deputies with the Monroe County Sheriff's Office. He was subsequently booked into the Monroe County Jail on a \$100,000 bond.
