♦ HIGHWAY 68 TO BE CLOSED TWO DAYS

If you've been looking forward to the complete re-opening of State Highway 68 between Spring City and Grandview, you won't have to wait much longer. But, it will get worse before it gets better. The Tennessee Department of Transportation says workers will be closing the highway completely this coming Monday and Tuesday, July 16th and 17th, starting at 5 a.m. Monday. The road was closed by a rock slide on April 24th. In May, one lane was opened, but trucks were not allowed. TDOT says they need to close the road completely to allow crews full access to the work site to complete rebuilding the outside lane, pave, mark the pavement, and install guardrails. TDOT says by doing this, it will speed up completion of the project and allow the road to be reopened with both lanes nearly a week sooner than if the road is kept open with one lane during the remainder of the work. Meantime, in McMinn County, County Road 2 (the Lower Spring Creek Road) is closed for bridge replacement. Detour signs have been posted. No word from the McMinn County Highway Department on how long the bridge replacement will take.

TODAY IN HISTORY - JULY 13th

- **1863** More than 1,000 people were killed in New York City when riots broke out in opposition to the military draft. **1865** Horace Greeley wrote an editorial in the New York Tribune newspaper in which he said, "Go west, young man, go west." His comment was directed toward the unemployed.
- **1923** A sign consisting of 50-foot-tall letters spelling out "HOLLYWOODLAND" was dedicated in the Hollywood Hills to promote a subdivision (the last four letters were removed in 1949)
- **1939 -** Frank Sinatra made his first commercial recording, "From the Bottom of My Heart" and "Melancholy Mood," with Harry James and his Orchestra for the Brunswick record label.
- **1960** John F. Kennedy won the Democratic presidential nomination at the party's convention in Los Angeles.
- 1962 Bluegrass singer Rhonda Vincent was born.
