#### BE READY FOR TRAFFIC PROBLEMS

- Norfolk Southern plans to perform maintenance and repair work to the railroad today, weather permitting. The railroad crossing at Railroad Avenue and Georgia Avenue will be affected during the work which could take a day or two.

- As part of TDOT's work to widen Highway 30, crews will be relocating and connecting a new wastewater main at the intersection with Elizabeth Street. The area to be affected is Elizabeth Street from Highway 30 (White Street) to the parking lot entrance of the East Side Shopping Center. The closure will be from Wednesday, Sept. 26th to Monday, October 1st, during the hours of 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. each night. Access to the East Side Shopping Center businesses will remain for Elizabeth Street and Highway 30 and access to Don Armando's will be via Highway 30 only.

#### ♦ UTILITY RATES TO INCREASE

Athens Utilities Board's directors are considering three rate increases. One is a 1.5% increase by TVA in its wholesale rates which will be effective October 1st. The other two rate actions being considered by AUB would increase power rates just under one percent and would phase-in an increase in natural gas rates over the course of 18 months. Both of the AUB local rate actions, if approved, will be effective November 1st. The power rate increases will add about \$3.00 to the average residential bill. Natural gas users will see an increase of about \$2.00 per month.

◆ Brett Kavanaugh, the president's Supreme Court nominee, spoke out Monday in an interview with Fox News, saying, "I've never sexually assaulted anyone" and insisting, "I'm not going anywhere." Kavanaugh's accuser, Christine Blasey Ford is telling lawmakers that "fear will not hold me back from testifying" against Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh. Ford wrote committee chairman Sen. Chuck Grassley a letter offering to both publicly testify and tell lawmakers in person her side of the story. ◆ A 74-year-old man has been found alive in an apartment building in Washington, D.C., five days after it was nearly gutted by fire. The man was taken to a local hospital with non-lifethreatening injuries. His identity has not been released.
