♦ ATHENS VOTERS CHOOSE COUNCIL MEMBERS

Two incumbents were re-elected to the Athens City Council on Tuesday; Bo Perkinson and Dick Pelley. Perkinson was the top vote getter with 1594 and Pelley received 1469 votes. A newcomer, Mark Lockmiller, received 1591 votes, only 3 shy of Perkinson. Lockmiller will take the seat of Yvonne Raper, another incumbent, who received 1098 votes. The McMinn County Election Commission said that the final results may vary some, because a few provisional ballots were not included in the unofficial final tally last night.

- ◆ Authorities in St. Louis have charged two former day care teachers with one count of endangering the welfare of a child after the two women were captured on video surveillance encouraging preschool-age children to fight each other. Police have alleged that the children were "encouraged and directed" to "engage in fistfights" with one another. The fighting involved at least six children over a 35 minute period. The children wore oversized gloves on their hands when they were fighting.

Howard Baker and later counsel to President Reagan for the final two years of his administration. He advised Sen. John McCain on his search for a running mate in 2008 and performed that task
