♦ On Wednesday, Jeff Sessions resigned as attorney general after being asked to do so by President Trump. Sessions wrote in an undated letter to the president, "At your request, I am submitting my resignation." Sessions wrote that he was honored to be sworn in as Attorney General of the United States. He also said that he came to work at the Department of Justice every day determined to do his duty and serve his country. Matthew G. Whitaker, Sessions' chief of staff, will serve as acting attorney general.

WEDNESDAY: The stock market closed higher, led by the technology, health care and consumer discretionary sectors. For the U.S. Midterm election, Republicans maintained control of the Senate while Democrats won control of the House.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 545 points or 2.1% to 26,180. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 58 points or 2.1% to 2,814, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 195 points or 2.6% to 7,571. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold fell \$1.07 to \$1,226.10, and the price of crude oil fell \$0.64 to \$61.57.

Treasury prices were higher while yields were lower. The 30-year Treasury yield closed lower at 3.44% and the 10-year Treasury yield finished higher at 3.23%.
