- ♦ More than 149,000 people throughout the Golden State have been evacuated as a result of the California wildfires. At least 31 people have been killed, 228 are missing and 7,000 structures have been destroyed.
- ♦ Stacey Abrams, the Democratic candidate in Georgia's still-uncalled governor's race, has filed a lawsuit asking that all provisional ballots be counted. Provisional ballots are considered a fail-safe for voters who arrive at the polls without all the necessary documentation at that time, but whose ballots can be verified in the days after the election.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks began the week by selling off sharply. Major news was focused on the U.S. government's announced plan to use export controls, among other measures, to counter perceived Chinese theft of U.S. companies' intellectual property. The technology sector led the broader selloff today with Apple a notable laggard due to reports that demand for the company's new iPhones may be weaker than originally expected. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 602 points or 2.3% to 25,387. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 55 points or 2.0% to 2,726. The NASDAQ Composite Index was down 206 points or 2.8% to 7,201.
