◆ LOCAL POWER RATE TO EDGE UP

Local electric power rates will move up in December as we move from the "transition" base rate period into the first of four winter rate months. As a result, AUB says the average household will pay about \$2.70 more per month. AUB advises customers to plan now on ways to keep warm air inside and cold air outside. Simple steps include adding additional insulation to attics and crawl spaces, weather stripping around doors and windows, and setting thermostats at 68 or 70.

◆ The two warring parties in Yemen have agreed to come to peace talks in Sweden. The Yemeni government, militarily backed by Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates, will participate in "consultations" with the Houthi rebels, a religiouspolitical movement aligned with Iran. The Houthis announced they would halt rocket attacks against Saudi Arabia and UAE. It's estimated at least 10,000 civilians have been killed. Starvation and diseases like cholera are widespread, and 14 million people are on the brink of famine.
