#### **♦ JOBLESS RATE HOLDS STEADY**

The unemployment rate in the Athens area held fairly steady from September to October. The jobless rate in McMinn County was unchanged at 4.2% both months. The Meigs County unemployment rate in October was 4.6%, up a tick from 4.5% in September. In Monroe County, unemployment in October was 3.8% percent, down a tick from 3.9% in September. Polk County's jobless rate in October was 4.2%, up slightly from 4.1% in September. Bradley County's unemployment rate was unchanged at 3.8% for both October and September.

#### ◆ ROAD WORK AT TELLICO & RAILROAD

The Athens Public Works Department announces that improvements to the intersection at Tellico Avenue and Railroad Avenue will get underway at 7 a.m. Monday. The work is expected to continue until June 30th. Motorists are advised to watch for traffic pattern changes, traffic signage, and workers.

#### **♦** REPAVING TO BEGIN ON HIGHWAY 305

Traffic on Highway 305 between Congress Parkway and I-75 will be down to one lane as contractors pave a section of the highway where they had been unsuccessfully trying a technique known as FDR (Full Depth Reclamation) to repair the rough pavement. The section will be paved for the winter. It should be completed in December. At this point, plans are to make more permanent repairs to the section of highway next spring.

#### **♦ FORMER ENGLEWOOD MAYOR ARRESTED**

The former mayor of Englewood has been arrested for allegedly threatening to "shoot" a city employee. James Cox, 76, was taken into custody by the McMinn County Sheriff's office after a criminal summons was issued. Cox recently resigned as Englewood's mayor. The alleged incident took place in September while he was still mayor. Cox was released on bond. He is scheduled to appear in McMinn General Sessions Court this Thursday.

#### **♦** "NO CONFIDENCE" VOTE ON PELLEY

The Athens City Council has passed by 4 to 1 a "vote of no confidence" in fellow council member Dick Pelley. The motion was made by outgoing council member Yvonne Raper. The no confidence vote is actually nothing more than a "slap on the wrist." Raper made the motion because she said Pelley had failed to comply with all the sanctions the council passed against him in April for violating city harassment policies. Pelley says the allegations against him are bogus, and he blamed them primarily on the inexperience of City Manager C. Seth Sumner. On a positive note, the two men say they are willing to sit down and try to work out their differences.

◆ FOOTBALL: A great football season has ended for the Meigs County Tigers. They lost to Trousdale County Friday night in the Class 2A semi-finals. The score was Trousdale 32, Meigs County 29. The Vols lost to Vandy, 38-13, on Saturday.
