#### ◆ 2ND ANNIVERSARY OF THE BIG TORNADO

Two years ago today, a tornado touched down in the early morning hours in the Cedar Springs Road area. The twister hop scotched northward for 11 miles, taking down cell phone towers, damaging or destroying virtually every house in the Deerfield Estates area along Highway 307, and causing heavy damage to the Save-a-Lot, the Daily Post-Athenian, C&D Tires, WYXI Radio, and Fairview Baptist Church and Fairview Christian Academy. Now, two years later, the DPA is back in its building, although the newspaper is being printed elsewhere. Save-a-Lot is

open. C&D is in the process of rebuilding at its S. White Street location, WYXI's studio and transmitter buildings have been repaired. Construction is moving right along on Fairview Christian Academy's new facility.

### **Three Die in Highway 11 Crash**

A traffic crash Wednesday afternoon on U.S. 11 at Reagan Station, north of Niota, took the lives of three people--a young woman and two small children. State Trooper Ben Harrison says Morgan Goldman, 18, of Athens (shown right in a Facebook photo) was killed along with her two nieces, ages 1 and 5. Trooper Harrison's report says Ms. Goldman was traveling on County Road 351 and pulled up to the intersection with Highway 11 around 3:15 p.m. She pulled onto Highway 11 to make a left turn and was struck on the driver's side by a northbound pickup truck that was passing



a northbound pickup truck that was passing several other vehicles. Ms. Goldman and the two little girls were killed. The driver of the pickup was injured. She was identified as



30-year-old Raquel Brady of Athens. Trooper Harrison says charges against Brady are pending. Morning Fax reader Dan Lehman sent the photo of the wreck scene. A Go Fund Me account has
