

Do You Know the Laws in Athens?

Here are a few more items from the Municipal Code of the City of Athens.

- Noisy dogs are prohibited. No person shall own, keep, or harbor any dog which, by loud and frequent barking, whining, or howling, annoys the peace and quiet of any neighborhood.
- There is a limit of three dogs per household without a permit. Not more than three dogs shall be kept by any one household unless the owner has acquired a permit from the city's public works department. The animal control officer shall review each permit request to ensure compliance of the code prior to issuance of the permit.
- Fortune telling is prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct the business of, solicit for, or ply the trade of fortune teller, clairvoyant, hypnotist, spiritualist, palmist, phrenologist, or other mystic endowed with supernatural powers.
- Any person who, as the operator of a motor vehicle, strikes a domestic animal shall stop at once and render such assistance as may be possible and shall immediately report such injury or death to the animal's owner. If the owner cannot be located, the driver must report the accident to police.
