## **TODAY IN HISTORY - FEBRUARY 8th**

**1820 -** Civil war general William Sherman was born. General Sherman's greatest feat in the war was to march a Union army across Georgia, "from Atlanta to the sea," destroying the South's last economic resources on the way.

**1828 -** Fiction writer Jules Verne was born in France. He used scientific discoveries as the basis for his writings. Among his most famous stories are "Journey to the Center of the Earth," "20-Thousand Leagues Under the Sea," and "Around the World in 80 Days."

**1936 -** Singer Larry Verne was born. His "masterpiece" was "Please Mr. Custer."

**1940 -** Every 10th person in two Polish villages near Warsaw was shot to death in a Nazi reprisal for the deaths of two German soldiers.

**1948 -** Singer Dan Seals was born. He died in 2009. His hit records included "One Friend" and "Everything That Glitters Is Not Gold."
