National and State News

- Both Democrat and Republican negotiators admit that the "goalposts keep moving" and the "numbers are all over the place" when it comes to funding the government. The deadline is looming for another government shutdown if the two parties can't reach an agreement by this Friday.
- A woman has been arrested after she plowed through the front glass doors of a Los Angeles police station with a baby in her car. After talking to an officer, she then tried to back out as cops clung to the vehicle. Police said she will likely face DUI charges.
- A bill filed in the Tennessee General Assembly last week would punish people that file more than three public records requests within one year. House Majority Leader William Lamberth says the bill is needed to give government agencies a way to prevent "harassment" and endless requests for public records.

FRIDAY'S MARKET REDORT: U.S. stocks finished the day mixed. In economic news, the 2018 annual number of worker stoppages hit a 10-year record, driven by teacher strikes. U.S. Treasury bond prices rose as yields fell. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 63 points or 0.3% to 25,106. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 2 points to 2,701, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 10 points or 0.1% to 7,298. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold rose \$3.97 to \$1,314.07, and the price of crude oil rose \$0.07 to \$52.71.

TODAY IN HISTORY - FEBRUARY 11th

- **1847 -** Inventor Thomas A. Edison was born in Ohio. He was probably the greatest inventor in history. He changed the lives of millions of people with such inventions as the electric light, the phonograph, the movie projector, and the carbon telephone transmitter.
- **1929 -** The Vatican City became an independent state in Rome. It is the world's smallest "state," with just 108 acres and a population of about 800 people. It has its own stamps and coins. Its ruler is the Bishop of Rome, the Pope.
- **1935 -** Singer Gene Vincent was born. His biggest hit record was "Be-Bop-A-Lula" in 1956. He was injured in the car wreck that killed singer Eddie Cochran. Vincent died of a bleeding ulcer in 1971 at the age of 36.
- **1945 -** President Franklin D. Roosevelt, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and Soviet leader Josef Stalin wrapped up a conference at Yalta in the Crimea by signing a series of agreements on the governance of post-World War II Europe.
- **1965 -** U.S. and South Vietnamese planes staged the first bombing raids on North Vietnam in retaliation for Viet Cong attacks.
- **1975 -** Margaret Thatcher became the first woman to head a major party in Britain when she was elected leader of the opposition Conservative Party.
- **1990 -** South African black activist Nelson Mandela was freed after 27 years in captivity.
- **2008 -** The Defense Department charged Khalid Sheikh Mohammed with murder and war crimes in connection with the September 11th terrorist attacks.
- **2012 -** Singer Whitney Houston was found dead in a hotel room in Beverly Hills, Calif., at age 48. (Her death was later ruled an accidental drowning, with heart disease and cocaine use as contributing factors.)
