◆ ATHENS POLICE SEARCHING FOR SHOOTERS

At about 1:15 p.m. Thursday, Athens Police were dispatched to Forrest Avenue, in reference to a woman who believed she had been shot while sitting in her car. The woman called 911 and began fleeing the area. The victim was located and treated for wounds to her arms. She did not appear to have actually been shot, but she did suffer wounds to both arms from broken glass. However, evidence of gunshots were found on her vehicle and houses on Forrest Avenue. APD says they have numerous leads in the case and are attempting to identify the shooter or shooters. Since the shooting took place in the proximity of Ingleside Elementary School, officers contacted the school's staff and recommended that the school be placed on lockdown. APD asks that anyone having any further information about the case to call them at 423-744-2730.
