## Local and Area News

- ◆ **BELL & COCHRAN OPPOSE CELL PHONE BAN**  
The Tennessee House has passed legislation banning motorists from holding cell phones while driving. Under the bill, drivers would be able to use hands free devices only. The bill passed the House on Wednesday and now goes to the Senate. Rep. Mark Cochran voted no. Senator Mike Bell says he will also vote against the bill. Bell says Tennessee already has a “distracted driving” law which makes the bill unnecessary.
- ◆ **DETECTIVES INVESTIGATE FATAL SHOOTING**  
The McMinn County Sheriff’s Office is investigating the case of an Etowah woman who was killed Monday in a shooting. Deputies were called to Starr Regional Medical Center in Athens around 7:20 a.m. Monday where 32-year-old Casey Daugherty had died from an apparent accidental gunshot wound. Sheriff Joe Guy says she was driven to the hospital by her fiancé and her father. The shooting happened on County Road 609.
- ◆ **MEASLES CASE REPORTED IN EAST TENNESSEE**  
The Tennessee Dept. of Health has confirmed a case of measles in East Tennessee. Tennessee has had only 15 measles cases in the last decade. Symptoms include fever, runny nose, and body aches, plus a red rash that begins on the face. The virus is highly contagious.

## Next Week is Clean Up Week

- The annual Clean-Up Week takes place in Athens next week. You should have your items at curbside before 7 a.m. on Monday. There is no schedule for specific streets on a specific day. All city streets will be covered at least once during the event. Compressor/coolant lines must be removed from appliances, tires must be separated from the rims, scrap metal junk should be separated from non-metal items. Crews will NOT pick up gas tanks from vehicles or cooking grills and will not accept any roofing or siding shingles.

### TODAY IN HISTORY - APRIL 19<sup>th</sup>

- 1775** - The American Revolutionary War began at the Battle of Lexington, Massachusetts. Eight Minutemen were killed and 10 wounded in an exchange of musket fire with British Redcoat troops.
- 1897** - The first annual Boston Marathon — the first of its type in the United States — was run. John J. McDermott of New York City won.
- 1933** - The United States ended the "gold standard" for the dollar.
- 1934** - Dickie Goodman was born. He and his sidekick, Bill Buchanan, originated the novel approach to featuring bits of popular songs strung together to tell a story. Their biggest hit was "The Flying Saucer (Parts 1 & 2)" in 1956. Goodman also had a hit using the same approach in 1974 with a recording titled "Energy Crisis '74."
- 1995** - The Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City was destroyed by a bomb hidden in a rent-a-truck. 168 people including 19 children died in the blast.
