Storms Cause Power Problems

The storms that blew across Southeast Tennessee Monday night left hundreds of people in the dark in McMinn County. Volunteer Energy Cooperative says power went off around 10:20 p.m. in the



Spring Creek area when a tree fell and brought down two phases of a 69 kV line and twisted a power pole. The line and cross arms on the pole had to be replaced. The outage affected 1850 VEC customers. Power was restored to most of those customers around 9 a.m. Tuesday. However, more than 100 customers did not get their electric-

ity back until Tuesday evening. The outage also affected Athens Utilities Board. AUB says VEC transmission lines fell across AUB distribution lines on their Central Athens circuit 15 serving 349 customers. AUB got power restored to all but 50 of those customers by 6 a.m., but had to wait until VEC finished making repairs before getting those 50 customers back online. Both AUB and VEC repair crews worked through the night. They thank their customers for their patience.

Jeep & 18-Wheeler Collide

EMS was called out at 9 p.m. Monday to a wreck on Highway 411 North and County Road 410 when a 2004 Jeep SEW collided with a 2017 International Prostar tractor trailer. One patient had to

be extricated from the Jeep. The patient was transported by AMR to UT Knoxville. The Englewood and Etowah Rural Fire Departments responded, along with the McMinn County Sheriff's Department. THP Officer Dakota Bromley investigated.
