More History from Joe Guy

Kyker-Quisenberry Funeral home was a successful mortuary on the site of the present Sherman Hall on the TWU campus. Many local citizens required the care of Quisenberry and Kyker in their time of sorrow and loss.

But when a wandering group of Gypsies passed through Athens in February 1947, they too, required the services of Kyker and Quisenberry when an elderly lady of note, Rosie Uwanawich, who they referred to as their "Queen", died suddenly in their camp near Athens.

But Quisenberry and Kyker's good deed was soon overshadowed by hundreds of gypsies who descended from all across the country upon Athens and the funeral home for what turned out to be a week-long funeral to mourn the death of the Gypsy Queen. According to the story in the Daily Post Athenian, an exasperated Kyker and Quisenberry finally were able to hold the service, and then convinced the gypsies to take the Queen's body and move on, leaving the funeral home and the surrounding neighborhood in quite a wreck.

1781 - Los Angeles was founded by Spanish settlers.

1882 - Thomas Edison displayed the first practical electrical lighting system. The Pearl Street electric power station, Edison's steam powered plant, began operating and successfully turned on the lights in a one square mile area of New York City.

1888 - George Eastman received a patent for his roll-film camera and registered his trademark: Kodak.

1917 - The American expeditionary force in France suffered its first fatalities in World War I.

In the first live coast-to-coast TV broadcast, President Harry S Truman addressed the nation from the Japanese peace treaty conference in San Francisco.

2006 - "Crocodile Hunter" Steve Irwin, 44, died after a stingray's barb pierced his chest.

2007 - Toy maker Mattel Inc. recalled 800,000 lead-tainted, Chinese-made toys worldwide, a third major recall in just over a month.

2008- Sen. John McCain accepted the Republican presidential nomination at the party's convention in St. Paul, Minn.
