2011 - Two American hikers held for more than two years in an Iranian prison, returned to the United States.

National and World News

Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi, announced on Tuesday that the House would open a formal impeachment inquiry of President Donald Trump. The inquiry comes after a whistleblower filed a complaint in August with the Office of Intelligence Community Inspector General over a phone call made by Trump to a foreign leader. Third District Republican Congressman Chuck Fleischmann, stated that Tuesday's announcement is more of the same, and he believes that the President made the correct decision to release the transcript of his call sometime today. Fleischmann further said about the Speaker's announcement "It is sad, it is not good governance, and it is dividing our country." Democratic Congressmen Jim Cooper of Nashville's 5th district and Steve Cohen of the 9th district in Memphis both support impeachment inquiries against President Trump. Cooper stated that Congress should begin the process in our Constitution to levy formal charges against President Trump and that this is a very serious step, as the President's continuing misconduct requires that Congress uphold the Constitution and the laws of the land.

TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks declined the day on weaker economic data and mixed U.S./China trade headlines. Energy was the worst-performing sector. The U.S. home price index rose at its slowest pace since 2012. Volkswagen executives have been charged by German prosecutors on suspicion of misleading shareholders prior to the 2015 diesel emissions scandal. U.S. Treasury bond prices rose. Interest rates fell. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 142 points, or 0.5%, to 26,808. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 25 points or 0.8% to 2,966, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 119 points or 1.5% to 7,994.
