More History from Joe Guy

In 1939, 19-year old New Jersey native Leonard Lomell arrived at Tennessee Wesleyan College which he attended on an academic, athletic, and work scholarship. An excellent student, Lomell was active in campus life, graduating in 1941. Soon after returning to New Jersey, America was thrust into World War II, and in 1942 Lommell volunteered as a US Army Ranger. Sent to England for training, Lomell found himself a part of Operation Overlord, the largest military operation ever undertaken in the history of the world. And Lomell would have a job that the very success of the operation would depend on. On D-Day, Lomell and his fellow Rangers were among the first soldiers landing on the coast of France. The 225 Rangers climbed sheer cliffs while Germans dropped grenades all around them. Once at the top, the Rangers fought a mile inland, seeking the giant guns of Pointe-du-Hoc. If the Rangers did not disable these huge cannon, the rest of the landing craft and the soldiers inside would be destroyed. Fighting German soldiers the entire way, Lomell himself disabled 5 of the giant weapons, saving thousands of American soldier lives that day, later receiving the Distinguished Service Cross, the Silver Star, the Victory Medal and the Purple Heart. Leonard Lomell's actions that day were summed up by Historian Stephen Ambrose, who said other than General Eisenhower himself, the man most responsible for the success of D-Day was Leonard Lomell. An entire chapter of Tom Brokaw's Book, "The Greatest Generation" is dedicated to Lomell's story. The TWC graduate survived the war and later retired from a successful law practice in New Jersey. Speaking at the TWC commencement in 1999, Lomell remarked "Tennessee Wesleyan made me a better man, and World War II matured me." Leonard Lomell passed away in New Jersey in 2011.
