


Movie Star Returns Home to Athens

Former Athens resident and movie star Peggy Dow will return home to Athens this Friday for a special screening of the movie "Harvey" at the Athens Movie Palace at 4:30 p.m. with a question and answer session to follow. Peggy Dow appeared in numerous movies in the 1950s including the Oscar-winning film "Harvey" in which she co-starred with Jimmy Stewart. Her real name was Peggy Varnadow. She and her parents lived in a small home at 601 Ingleside Avenue which is still standing today. Her father founded Hydratane Gas Co. in Athens in 1947. Her married name is Peggy Helmerich. She decided to return to the Friendly City to help McMinn County celebrate its bicentennial. There is no cost

for admission to the special screening. The photos show Peggy as she looks today and as she appeared on the cover of Life Magazine in 1950.

A member of the Tennessee National Guard from Athens, Sgt. Ryan Grillo, has been awarded the Adjutant General's Ribbon for Valor for heroism. Grillo is a soldier with the 1176th Transporta-

tion Company. On September 26, 2018, while on his way to his civilian job in Athens during a heavy rainfall, Grillo came upon a bridge that had flooded. Two vehicles were stuck in the rising water. He drove across the bridge and saw a panicked woman in one car and a woman and child in the other. He and another man managed to pull all three to safety. The photo shows Tennessee's Adjutant Gen-



eral, Maj. Gen. Jeff Holmes, awarding him the Ribbon for Valor.
