1608 - English poet John Milton was born. He wrote "Paradise Lost," a poem based on the biblical account of the creation, the fall of Satan, and Adam and Eve.

1848 - Author Joel Chandler Harris was born in Eatonton, Georgia. He created the popular Uncle Remus stories about such characters as Brer Rabbit, Brer Fox, Brer Bear and the Tar Baby.

1907 - Christmas Seals were placed on sale in the post officers of Wilmington, Delaware, to raise money to fight tuberculosis.

1974 - White House aide John Ehrlichman testified at the Watergate Coverup Trial that President Richard Nixon was responsible for the coverup.

1957 - Singer Donny Osmond was born. He had such hit records as "Go Away Little Girl," "Puppy Love," and "A Million to One." He and his sister, Marie, also recorded together. Their hits included "I'm Leaving It All Up to You."
