Another Joe Guy History Minute

The most well-known of all historic Cherokee, the Beloved Woman, Nancy Ward, was part of early Tennessee History, and today rests in her grave at Woman Killer Ford on the banks of the Ocoee River in Polk County. But prior to moving to her last home, Nancy is believed to have lived for a short time in McMinn County on Mouse Creek.

A deed search of the old Cleage property and house that still stands on Highway 11 between Athens and Niota has revealed its original owners were the McIntoshes, a mixed blood Cherokee family who was awarded 640 acres there in 1817. History also tells us that, as an aged woman, Nancy Ward lived with the McIntosh's as they were close kin to her. She was later recorded as saying she became tired of the constant fighting among the family, likely over the looming question of Indian Removal to the west, which caused her to move to her son 5 Killer's home on the Ocoee to end her days in peace.

Although it was likely only a few years near the end of her life, McMinn County is proud to claim Nancy Ward as a past resident
