# **Community News You Can Use**

- ✓ The City of Athens has announced its schedule for the New Year's holiday. The Municipal Building, Public Works Department, Recycle Center, and Animal Shelter will be closed on Wednesday. They will re-open Thursday, January 2nd, during regular business hours. All emergency services will continue to operate on a 24-hour basis. Call 911 in the event of an emergency. Residential garbage collection will be as normal on Monday and Tuesday. The Wednesday, January 1st, garbage routes will be picked up on Thursday. The Thursday and Friday routes will be collected on Friday.
- ✓ Keep McMinn Beautiful reminds you to recycle your empty, broken-down Christmas boxes by bringing them to the Athens Recycle Center on Rocky Mount Road on Thursday, December 26th, from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- ✓ Tennessee Wesleyan University is celebrating McMinn County's Bicentennial by presenting 200 students with the Bicentennial Scholarship in the Fall 2020 semester. Students who received the scholarship must be starting at TWU for the first time in the Fall of 2020, have a permanent address in McMinn or Monroe counties, schedule and attend an individual campus visit, and be one of the first 200 visits during the 2019-2020 school year. Incoming freshmen who earn the Bicentennial Scholarship will receive \$2000 distributed over four years. Transfer students enrolling for the Fall semester will receive \$1,000 over two years.

## **More History by Joe Guy**

A bridge is a connection, a crossing, that channels both commerce and history.

The Hiwassee River railroad bridge was constructed in 1837, as part of the Hiwassee railroad. After a few years of bankruptcy, the railroad was revived as the East Tennessee and Georgia, and the line extended south to Dalton and north toward Lenoir City.

During the Civil War, the bridge was a critical link in the war effort for both sides, its importance noted even by President Lincoln, so much so that it was a victim of the Union bridge burning plot of 1861. It was rebuilt and used throughout the war, the site of numerous engagements.

In September 1863, Confederate cavalry under Gen. Forrest fought their way across the bridge, and it was damaged again in November 1863 as General Longstreet retreated from Chatta-

The modern railroad bridge still rests on the original pilings set in 1837, a reminder of the bridges that carried trains, soldiers, citizens, and goods up and down the Tennessee Valley.


