
♦ TENNESSEE EMPLOYMENT LOOKS GOOD

More Tennesseans took home paychecks in November, leading to a slight drop in statewide unemployment. Data from the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development shows a 0.1 percent decrease in unemployment compared to October. The November rate was 3.3 percent. February was the month with the lowest statewide unemployment, 3.2 percent. Over the past year, nonfarm employment in Tennessee increased by 46,700 jobs. The leisure/hospitality sector created the largest number of new jobs in the state, followed by the professional/ business services and education/health services sectors. The state will release the November 2019 county unemployment rates later today.
