

### Friday's Coronavirus Update

✓ As of Thursday afternoon, the number of cases of the coronavirus in McMinn County increased by 3. There have been 92 confirmed cases in McMinn County with one death. At this point, five of the patients have recovered. Monroe County has a total of 20 cases, with 10 recovered and one death. Bradley County's total number of cases so far is 49. Thirty-eight of the patients have recovered and one died. In Meigs County, there have been eight cases, and three of the patients have recovered. Polk County has eight cases. Five of those patients have recovered. Rhea County is reporting five cases and four have recovered. Statewide, there have been 10,735 cases of the coronavirus in Tennessee and 199 deaths.

#### **MORE VIRUS-RELATED NEWS**

• Athens Utilities Board is extending the hardship suspension on utility disconnects and late fees until May 18th. It is important to note that there will NOT be another extension to the schedule. These are key dates: On May 18th all accounts that are over 90 days in arrears will be subject to immediate disconnect. On June 1st, all accounts that are in arrears over 60 days will be subject to immediate disconnect. On June 15th, all accounts that are over 30 days in arrears will be subject to immediate disconnect. On June 29th, AUB will return to normal service practices including disconnections and collection of late fees.

### **United Way Awards Grants**

United Way of McMinn & Meigs Counties has announced its first round of COVID-19 grants to non-profit agencies that have been working to help those affected by the coronavirus pandemic. They are Etowah Senior Center for delivering meals and basic supplies to their seniors who are homebound; Tri-County Center for delivering food and basic necessities to their residential clients; Boys & Girls Club of Meigs County for delivering afternoon meals and snacks to children with no transportation to pick up their meals at the club; Athens-McMinn Family YMCA for providing meals to 900 children each week; Grace & Mercy Ministries for providing free carryout meals to anyone in need on Mondays and Fridays; Meigs Ministries for providing food, rent and utility assistance; Full Circle Women's Medical Center for providing free diapers and wipes for families who are facing economic hardship; Coordinated Charities for providing groceries, rent, and utility assistance. In just four weeks, CC has provided more than 1,500 families with groceries and over 400 families with rent and utility assistance; Athens City Schools for meal deliveries to children in low income areas: Nourish One Child for weekend food bags to Athens City School students; Hiwassee Mental Health Center for rent and utility assistance for clients; and Love, Period (St. Paul's Episcopal Church) for providing personal hygiene products to women and girls who cannot afford the necessary items.
