Latest Update on Coronavirus


The TN Department of Health reports McMinn County has a total of 107 cases of the coronavirus. Thirteen of the patients have recovered. Three deaths are now reported in McMinn County. Bradley County has had 61 cases, with 47 recoveries and one death. Monroe County's total number of cases is 26. Fifteen of those have recovered. There has been one death in Monroe Co. Meigs County's total stands at 11 cases with four recovered. Polk County's total is 12, with 8 patients recovered. Statewide, the number of cases is 13,938. There have been 239 deaths. Meantime, the Shaw plant in Decatur has shut down after an employee tested positive for COVID-19. The plant will be reopened after cleaning and disinfecting. Workers who came in close contact with the associate who tested positive will have to self-quarantine.

MORE VIRUS-RELATED NEWS

✓ Free face masks will soon be available at the McMinn County Health Department and other health departments across the state. Governor Lee's Unified Command Group is partnering with Renfro, a sock company headquartered in North Carolina. They will make washable, reusable cloth face masks at their facility in Cleveland. The state will supply the first 300,000 Renfro masks, based on population, to Tennessee's health departments this week. Each health department will be allocated 1,000 masks. Residents needing a mask will be able to pick them up at the county health departments.

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REDORT: U.S. equities ended the day lower. U.S. private payroll fell by more than 20 million in April. Disney reported earnings below expectations and announced it is suspending its dividend for the first half of the year. Treasury prices dipped. Interest rates increased.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 218 points or 0.9% to 23,665. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 20 points or 0.7% to 2,848, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 45 points or 0.5% to 8,854.

In bond markets, the 30-year Treasury yield traded higher at 1.40%, and the 10-year Treasury yield traded higher at .70%. In commodity markets, the spot price of gold fell \$21.20 to \$1,689.40, and the price of crude oil fell \$0.40 to \$24.16.



AUB Pledges COVID-19 Money

Athens Utilities Board is using its Warm Neighbors Fund to work with the United Way of McMinn and Meigs Counties to provide money to the needy communities as the COVID-19 crisis continues in the area. AUB's Wayne Scarbrough also says TVA has agreed to assist. Scarbrough says the United Way is using \$5,000 it had raised for COVID-19 support and AUB is using \$5,000 from its Warm Neighbors Fund. He says TVA has agreed to match that amount. Seventy-five percent of the total money, or \$15,000, will be used for aid in rental and utility assistance. The remaining \$5,000 will be used for food assistance. Coordinated Charities, led by Executive Director Kevin Lane, will be in charge of administering the resources.
